Campaigns, debates, elections...and chance encounters!





Wow, what an exciting term we've had with our inquiry unit about how government works in Aotearoa! We started the term with a mock election and waited eagerly to see if our results matched the real election results. We've learned about roles within government, how laws are made, and about important moments in the history of our parliament such as Women's Suffrage. We got to tour parliament, visit the media room in the Beehive, and Rooms 6 and & 7 were lucky enough with their timing to meet the prime minister! (The Parliament Educator told us this has only happened twice in her 3 years in the job!) Not only that, but David Seymour bummed into Room 7 on the steps of Parliament and he was very impressed with their knowledge about the MMP system.





After Parliament we visited the National Library's He Tohu exhibit and got to view some very special taonga...the 1835 Declaration of Independence, the 1893 Women's Suffrage Petition...and the Treaty of Waitangi documents! Wow! It was so amazing seeing such old and precious documents. If you get a chance to take your whānau over the summer holidays, we really recommend this free exhibition.









Inspired by all we've learned, we have been busy over the last two weeks creating our own parties to govern Pāuatahanui School. To get ready for their upcoming election students have been drafting policies, coming up with campaign posters and slogans, and deciding on important roles within their parties. This week we held debates, with each party sharing their ideas about health, education, tourism,
