What's Happened So Far

Over the last few years Pauatahanui School has invested a significant amount of resource into ensuring that we have an excellent IT infrastructure.

During 2015 the Year 7 & 8 class introduced a 1:1 device environment. From 2017 we expanded this to a BYOD Year 5-8 students. This has allowed students and teachers to grow their digital capability and explore new ways of learning using digital tools. To manage this we have the student management system Hapara.

Hapara provides:

- **Visibility:** makes learner online activity visible.
- **Differentiation:** enables differentiation of online instruction.
- **Security:** creates a safe learning environment.
- **Insight:** drive powerful teaching and learning conversations.

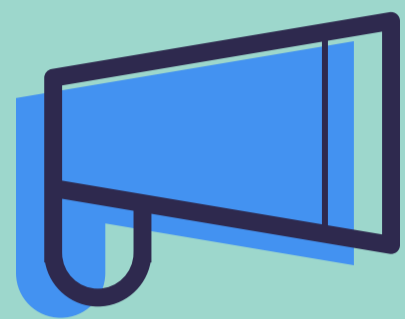

As a **FUTURE FOCUSED** school we are inviting mobile technologies into classrooms at Pauatahanui School. Bring Your Own Device, allows students to bring in their own device for learning.

The device we recommend is a chromebook.

Students use these tools for educational purposes in the classroom. These devices are not compulsory.

If there are occasions when the class is working in a digital way, everyone in the class will have the opportunity to use the tools they need.

For students to bring their own device to school, so they can experience the advantages of learning in a digital environment.

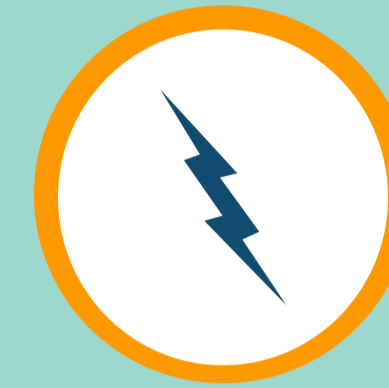
- To be a future focused school we want to create digital citizens who work together collaboratively online, whether they are at home or at school.

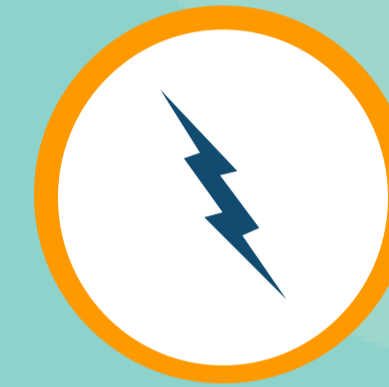

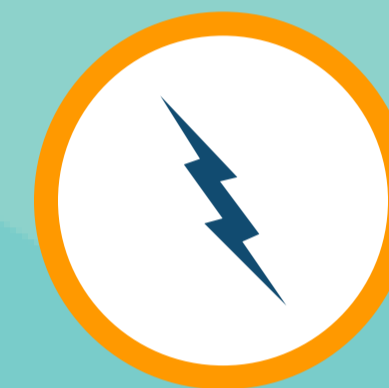

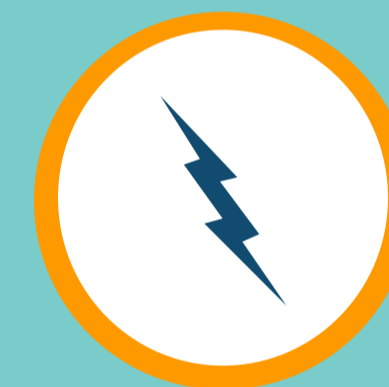
Using tools such as Google docs' teachers are able to create and facilitate an online program of work for students.



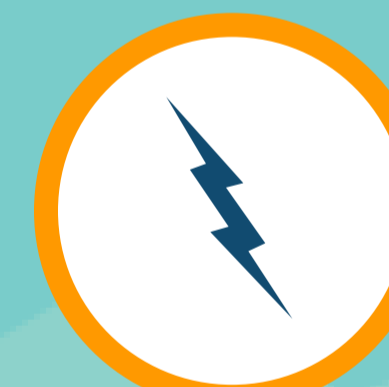
Students create and develop their own 'digital' folders as they complete work.



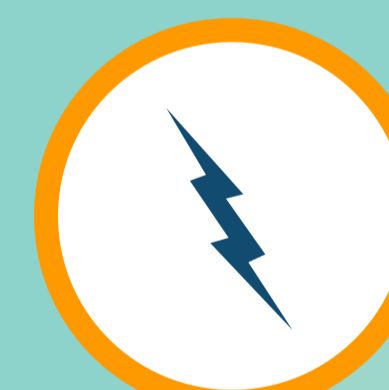
Engaged and motivated students.



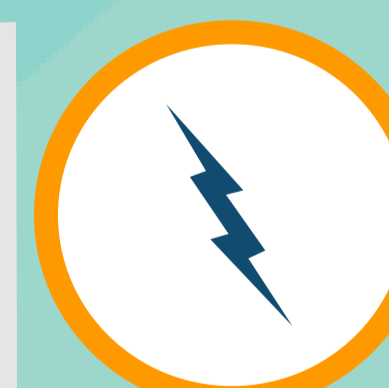
Student choice - Students are able to select the best way to prepare, present and share their work.



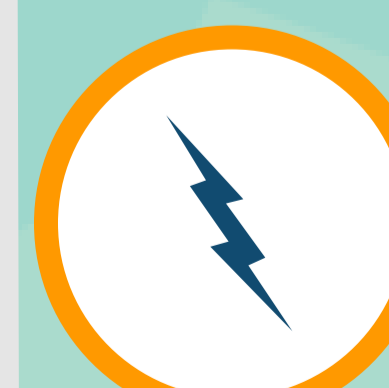
Students are able to work collaboratively with other students outside of the 'normal' school hours.



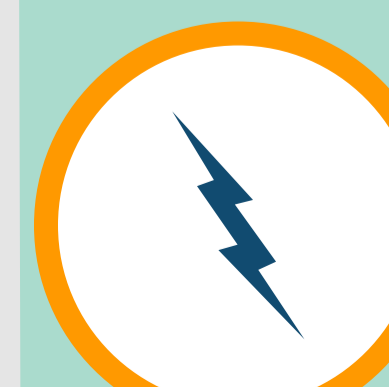
Allows students to have anywhere, anytime access to class resources, extension activities and support.
