#### Signage foundation stabilisation work, SH1 northbound off-ramp to SH58

From 10<sup>th</sup> September, over a three-week period, there will be signage repair works beside the northbound off-ramp from Te Aranui o Te Rangihaeata – Transmission Gully to SH58.

Between 10pm and 3am, the off-ramp will be closed at times as trucks drop off equipment and materials to the worksite.

During this time, all northbound motorists wanting to access SH58 will be advised to take the Waitangirua off-ramp. Heavy vehicles are advised to use other state highways (e.g. SH2/SH59) to get to SH58. SH1 will be operating as normal. For motorists who miss the recommended route displayed on the VMS signage, a limited number of vehicles will be able to exit at the SH58 offramp. However, temporary traffic lights will be in place, and delays may be up to 10 minutes, while equipment and materials are unloaded.

Please plan your journey accordingly to avoid any disruption and follow the detour or use alternative routes. There will be limited space and possible delays at the SH58 off-ramp. If you miss the detour and are unable to take the SH58 off-ramp, the available exit is Mackays Crossing.


### KAWHIA HUB (Rooms 3, 4, 5 and 9A)
