

We also just finished looking at the early concepts of rotation, reflection and translation. Room 5 had a go at using some of these concepts as part of their artwork last week.







have been giving up many of their lunchtimes to rehearse for the show. As they work with each class, their hard-work is really shining through. It's so encouraging to see these role models in action.


