It has been a busy, but fun term! There have been camps, school sleepover, athletics days, walks around the inlet, basketball lessons, pancake races and the list goes on.

Term 2 is shaping to be just as busy and fun, which will culminate in an end of term production! A team of teachers have already begun the planning for this and we will share more information and details about the production as we get closer to the event. It will be great to see the children getting a chance to showcase their artistic talents and creativity.

Teacher Only Days:

I thought it would be useful to share what staff will be doing during the two teacher only days.

Thursday 6th April - Whole staff Structured Literacy professional development. Last year teachers in the junior school undertook professional development in Structured Literacy with Massey University. We want to keep this momentum going and will be extending Structured Literacy into the senior school this year. We have been able to secure funding to allow us to work with Learning Matters who will continue our Structured Literacy journey.

Monday 24th April - The Ministry of Education has been working on refreshing the New Zealand Curriculum. This is exciting for schools as the current curriculum is a great one, but is in need of a few minor tweaks. We have already begun working with aspects of the new curriculum. This term we implemented the Aotearoa Histories aspect of the Social Sciences curriculum. The next areas that we will need to familiarise ourselves with are the Literacy and Numeracy refreshed curriculum. To enable schools to do this effectively the Ministry of Education has provided

schools with two teacher only days, the first being Monday 24th April. On this day all staff will be attending a North Porirua Kahui Āko conference at Aotea College. It will be great for Pāuatahanui School staff to have the opportunity to work alongside all other North Porirua schools on this day.

Holiday break:

I would like to wish everyone a relaxing and enjoyable Easter break. I think everyone deserves a bit of a break so we can come back ready and rearing to go for term 2.

we did ask Dan where the church bell came from but he wasn't sure so we're hoping that someone may be able to tell us!


















RAUKAWA HUB (Rooms 6, 7, 8)
